

2026 New Vision, New Purpose, New Plan

Vision Outline

It may seem convenient for us to have a specific focussed vision/strategy, so that we could say 'it's youth', 'it's children', 'it's families', 'it's the elderly', but this, in a small market town, is way too simplistic.

In a town of 12,000, unlike a city church, we cannot afford to be selective, as there simply aren't the spirit-filled churches working alongside each other to divide out the various opportunities.

What we do know is that in:

1 Tim 2:4 God wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

and

2 Peter 3:9 God does not want anyone to perish, but for everyone to come to repentance.

God has never given us a specific focussed vision/strategy, but instead has raised gifted men and women up as 'champions' to serve and reach out in many ways, at the right time, as He sees fit.

Paul says in 1 Corinthians 9:22 'I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some'.

That is our goal, to get alongside all different kinds of people so that by all the means God gives us, we help people to find Jesus.

The Church was Gods idea for the extension of His purposes and as Christians we are called and chosen for His purpose, not simply to go to heaven. Church is not just for us either; it's to glorify God and as we are strengthen and enabled in Him, we bring healing for the nations (Rev 22:2). As William Temple said, "The Church exists primarily for the sake of those who are still outside it', (frequently quoted wrongly as, 'the only organisation that exists solely for the benefit of non-members'). Primarily being the key word not exclusively, as we need to care, grow and share life together as a church.

We value . . .

The Bible, Gods Word, made alive by the Holy Spirit and who brings fresh revelation.

The Church, Gods People, not a place or a building but people of all ages and nationalities sharing life together - not just Sundays. Equipping and encouraging all to serve and to grow.

Jesus, the only one who brings us into a relationship with our Heavenly Father.

The priesthood of all believers, in that all can serve and participate.

Believers baptism by full immersion in water as a personal declaration of faith.

The Holy Spirit, who still works today and gives special gifts and ministries for the encouragement of the church and who empowers us to share the love of Jesus.

The Baptism of the Holy Spirit to empower us for all that God has for us to do; using His gifts to build up ourselves, the whole church and in touching others outside the church.

Worship that is real and prize the presence of God and the freedom that the Holy Spirit brings.

Prayer, embracing it as a necessity to see God move.

Fellowship, where we build friendships and disciple each other.

Elders, their wives and a leadership team made up of gifted men and women, gladly submitting to them and as we also submit to one another.

Apostolic ministry that we can share in and receive support from as we walk in relationship with them.

The gospel, in word and deed, helping people to find new life in Jesus.

Marriage between a man and a woman which also provides the place for raising children.

Singleness, understanding the challenges that can bring at times, whilst it giving the opportunity to serve God in a meaningful way.

Those who are same sex attracted, giving them the opportunity to be celibate and fully serve the Lord.

Watergate Centre Building Purpose

How does this relate to Watergate Centre?

Watergate Centre is owned and run by Beacon Church. It is where Beacon Church meets and carries out many church activities; it is our home.

It is where we meet to encounter God through worship, prayer, teaching and being equipped for His service.

It is also a resource that God has given us to express His Kingdom by letting our light shine, in reaching out to our community in many and in various ways, allowing walls to come down and bridges to be made with people and groups in our town. We welcome the community into our space through social action and practical help, reflecting the love of Jesus to all.

Watergate Centre is neither a church or a community centre, it is a place for the church and its activities to function, as well as a place that can be used by the community. Much like Moses' staff, as we lay it down, it becomes a consecrated tool in the hands of the church to show Gods power and presence.

God said to Moses 'what's that in your hand'?

It was just a stick, but once thrown down in obedience to God it became something miraculous.

Watergate Centre is just bricks and mortar, but God can use it miraculously in reaching the lost if we lay it down in service to Him. The building has to serve Gods purposes and we should be careful to never serve the building.

George Fox, founder of The Quakers, broke with contemporary thinking that church was people and not a building and where they assembled made no difference. When they did have buildings, for that very reason, they called them a 'meeting house'. He defiantly referred to traditional church buildings as 'Steeple-House' to emphasise the point.

We are the church, His people, a worshipping community, whose chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. Whether we meet in the Civic Centre, Watergate Centre or in a tent, we meet as the church wherever and whenever, and we are no less or more the church depending on where we meet.

Having such a resource costs money to run & maintain and therefore, we are not ashamed to raise revenue from it through hiring out, whilst staying within our ethical guidelines and lettings policy (See Policy No. 51).

The source is not so much the issue as to the good financial stewardship of the elders, trustees and finance team.

All gifts given become sanctified in the hands of God.

Some giving, particularly by grant organisations, may be 'restricted' in its use, but we would never be obligated to the donor either legally or spiritually.

Proverbs 13:22 says, 'A good person leaves an inheritance for their children's children, but a sinner's wealth is stored up for the righteous.'

We also recall the many 'spoils' the Israelites possessed, including all they brought out of Egypt.
